

Preamble

This file demonstrates how icite can be used to produce an index of passages cited in combination with Bib_LA_TE_X.

The relevant part of the preamble which is used here follows:

Remarks

- (a) `citecmd=autocite` instructs icite to use the `\autocite` command to insert the citations in the body text.
- (b) `defaultindex=none` disables indexing by default.
- (c) `\IndexSubtypeAs{ancient}{icite-biblatex-primary}` makes an exception for authors whose `entrysubtype` field matches the string `ancient` and instructs icite to have them indexed in an index named `icite-biblatex-primary`.
- (d) To actually produce the index, `\printindex[icite-biblatex-primary]` is needed at the end of the document.
